- 53 students made a profession of faith this year.
- The Class of 2011 was accepted to 75 universities and will attend 33 universities in 19 states. Some of the schools to be attended include Washington and Lee, Wake Forest University, Rhodes College, University of Virginia, Davidson College, Boston University, Johns Hopkins University, Knox College and leading Texas universities.
- Exceeding the state SAT average of 1462, and a national average of 1509, the average SAT score for the SBS Class of 2011 was 1806. The Class of 2011 was offered academic and athletic scholarships totaling over \$3 million.
- 5 seniors named as National Merit Finalists, 3 as National Merit Commended Scholars, and 1 as National Hispanic Scholar.
- Art students won 2nd place in the TAPPS State Art Competition and won a Gold Medal at the Rodeo Art Competition.
- Lower School students read over 10,000 books, totaling more than 105 million words through the Accelerated Reader Program. 37 students read over 1 million words each, 3 students read over 2 million words each, 1 student read over 3 million words and 1 student read over 5 million words.
- Nationwide, over 67,000 Middle School students participated in the Duke Talent Identification Program. The national average SAT math score by participants was 450. Thirteen SBS students received State Recognition and their average math score was 560.
- 9 members of the Class of 2011 will participate in collegiate athletics. The Athletic Department claims 22 state championships in 8 different athletic events.
- 10 Upper School students were named AP Scholars by the College Board and 3 were named AP Scholars with Honor.
- Angels of Light: LS donated over 450 toys, MS nearly 300 sports watches, US held a toy drive and served over 300 hours.
- 11 students competed in the TAPPS Academic State Competition and 3 students competed in the TAPPS Music State Competition.
- 3 students received TPSMEA All-Region Choir Recognition and 2 received All-State Choir Recognition. One student received TMEA Region Choir Recognition.
- 44 Upper School students were inducted into the National Honor Society.
- Lower School participated in 15 field trips throughout the school year. The variety of field trips included the George Bush Library, Bellaire Nature Center, Houston Arboretum, Houston Museum of Natural Science, and the San Jacinto Monument
- SBS had 58 student athletes listed on All District teams, 22 listed as All State, and 14 listed as Academic All State.
- In 2010-2011, SBS had 1 Regional Finalist team, 1 State Semi-Finalist team, 2 State Runner-up teams, 1 State Champion team, 10 students who were part of State Champion swim relays and 2 students who were named individual event State Champions.
- The fifth annual Middle School musical, *Peter Pan*, had 4 sold-out performances and over 2,000 people in attendance.
- Upper School appointed 7 seniors as the School's first group of Prefect leaders.
- 1 Upper School athlete named Built Ford Tough Player of the Week and 1 Upper School athlete named to the TPSCA South All-Star Football Team.
- Representatives from over 100 universities traveled to SBS for College Day.
- 47 students participated in the First Annual Lower School Spelling Bee.
- Upper School students in the Fine Arts Department continued the annual tradition of performing at Houston's Hobby Center for the Performing Arts. This year's spectacular show, *South Pacific*, had 3 sold-out performances with nearly 2,000 in attendance.
- Lower School performed at 4 Grandparent Day programs including the Parade of Presidents and "What I Want to be When I Grow Up."
- The 2011 Celebration Book Fair added 500 new books to the Woliver-Anderson Library.
- The Second Fund raised more than \$500,000. The 5th annual EagleFest raised over \$392,000 for the SBS Faculty Endowment, and the 5th annual Distinguished Speaker Luncheon raised over \$330,000 for a Christmas bonus for faculty as well as salary increases in the upcoming year.
- The Fine Arts Director's Circle raised over \$28,000 for the Upper School musical, *South Pacific*.
